# Hagi Museum @

The museum was built as a center of "Hagiology", which is one of the main focuses of the Hagi city plan.


The purpose of the museum is to play a main role in "Studies on Hagi" by conducting research and study in various fields such as characteristics of the Hagi area and artifacts & historical discoveries.

In Hagiology Exhibition Room, by looking at models of the land and sea you can discover Hagi's natural history. Through the three themes of the sea, stone and summer orange, you are able to study the relationship between people and nature.

## Hagi Castle Town @-@ (Jokamachi)

In this area, which was further away from Hagi Castle than Horiuchi, there lived low-ranked Samurais and merchants under lord patronage. Many historical houses remain in this quiet area.



#### **Kikugahama Beach** 6

A beautiful white sand beach lined with evergreen trees. It lies near the ruins of Hagi castle, with Mt. Shizuki on the left and some islands off the coast. The sunset view takes one's breath away. It is busy with those who enjoy swimming and marine sports in summer.



## Ruins of Hagi Castle (Shizuki Park) (Hagi Jo Seki)

Hagi castle was built in 1604 by Lord Terumoto Mori after his defeat at the Battle of Sekigahara. The castle was completed in three years and eight months, and it was destroyed in 1874 after Lord Takachika Mori moved his residence to Yamaguchi. Many people favor this place for its tranquility. Once inside the great stone walls you can enjoy the beauty of the castle garcen with its typical Japanese teahouse, old pine trees and white earthen walls with loopholes.



# The Aiba Waterway (Aibagawa) 🕮 🕮

The Aiba is a narrow waterway known for its simple beauty and colorful Japanese Carp. Not long age it was used daily by citizens and also for rice paddy irrigation and transportation. The canal flows along some old Samurai houses This is a place where you will truly find peace and tranquility.

#### Port of Hagi (Hamasaki) 43

# **Higashi Hagi Station**

Higashi Hagi Sta. on the Sanin Main Line is the main entrance to the town. Hagi is a pleasant town to be explored on foot or by bicycle. There are some rental cycle shops in this area.



# Shoin Shrine

Located in the eastern part of Hagi, this is the largest shrine in this area. This shrine is dedicated to Shoin(Terajiro) Yoshida, the great scholar of the late Edo period, whose disciples came to play key roles in the Meiji Restoration.





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
